Dear Members of the New Jersey Licensed Beverage Association:

Thank you for the opportunity to address the members of the New Jersey Licensed Beverage Association (NJLBA) on the occasion of your Annual Convention. On behalf of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, I want to thank the NJLBA for continuing to provide your expertise on the ever-evolving alcoholic beverage industry.

This year, the Division and the New Jersey alcoholic beverage industry addressed the new liquor license reform legislation. The NJLBA provided much needed feedback and assistance to the Division as we worked together to provide guidance to licensees and municipalities. While much has been accomplished, the Division will continue to rely on the NJLBA to partner on the issues that affect inactive licenses, intermunicipal transfers, and all other issues affecting on-premises consumption licensees.

The Division is working to update our regulations to address new areas of the law and changes in technology, and to ensure that existing legal requirements adapt to today's industry needs. In the next few months, the Division intends to propose new regulations on limited breweries and permits, and to issue guidance on the new expansion of premises legislation. The Division will also work with the Cannabis Regulatory Commission and relevant agencies as Hemp Beverage laws and regulations are enacted.

The Division values its relationship with the NJLBA, and looks forward to working on the important issues facing the industry and the people of the State of New Jersey in 2025.

News from the Lobby

With the US Federal elections (President, US Senate, US House) comfortably in our rearview mirror, the next political milestone is front and center: NJ will elect a new Governor and all 80 General Assembly seats are up for grabs on Tuesday, November 4, 2025. There are many exceptional candidates on both sides of the aisle and the June, 2025 gubernatorial primaries promise to be exciting. The NJLBA must engage with these candidates from both sides of the aisle. Stay tuned and please do your best to attend NJLBA fundraisers for our preferred candidates.

The NJLBA, and the NJ liquor industry in general, has just completed a two-year legislative term, unique in that Governor Murphy declared "license reform" to be his "number one legislative priority," and then proceeded to try and force through the worst piece of legislation that our industry has ever seen. If the Governor succeeded with this legislative folly, over 7000 NJ owners of plenary retail consumption licenses would have completely lost their license value (NJ average license cost is approximately \$400K) and many would be placed on the road to financial ruination. To strenuously fight the Governor's "plan," the NJLBA founded the Coalition for Responsible Alcohol Sales, along with the NJ Wine & Spirits Wholesalers Association, and the Beer Wholesalers Association of NJ. We also convinced the NJ Restaurant and Hospitality Association to join us and fight. Our coalition engaged in an intense two-year legislative battle resulting in victory. The bill that did emerge relies on existing inactive on-premises licenses to get re-activated, thereby assisting in meeting NJ's demand for on-premise opportunities – for both consumers and for industry entrepreneurs.

Unfortunately, the bill had some drafting lapses that will require the introduction and passage of a so-called "clean-up" bill to fix the lapses and other drafting errors. The NJLBA is closely working with legislative sponsors to accomplish the necessary language changes. It is our hope that we can get the clean-up bill introduced and passed by June, 2025 – at the latest. The sooner, the better.

One of the other major issues facing our industry in general, and our particular on-premises sector, is how to handle the responsible sales of federally legal hemp-derived THC beverages. In August, 2024, Governor Murphy signed a hemp-derived THC products bill into law. This bill, now law, included holders of NJ plenary wholesale licenses as well as holders of plenary retail distribution licenses in the list of those who may legally sell these hemp-derived THC beverages. There is currently no provision for plenary retail consumption licensees to sell these hemp-derived THC beverages.

The hemp-derived THC beverages bill also had some major drafting errors that drifted into constitutionality issues and, consequently, various hemp industry parties challenged the law in Federal District Court. The decision was reached in September, 2024 and the judge struck down the portion of the law requiring that the only hemp-derived beverages that could be sold in NJ had to be manufactured "in this state." The federal judge ruled that, because the hemp- derived products are federally legal, states are prohibited by the Dormant Commerce Clause to restrict the sale of interstate, hemp-derived THC products. The law contains some other legal problems as well, thus requiring a "clean-up" bill to have the proper language on the books.

As a "clean-up" bill is being drafted by an informal coalition of hemp and alcoholic bevcontinued on next page


erage players, the working draft, I'm happy to report, does include plenary retail consumption licensees as entities being able to carry and serve hemp-derived THC beverages. Stay tuned.

While the NJLBA typically finds itself in a defensive posture, beating back industry threats, I am pleased to report that we are working closely with a key legislator to introduce the following pieces of legislation:

- A bill to allow holders of plenary retail consumption licenses to conduct sports pools
 on their licensed premises, as long as the licensee (the house) does not take a cut.
- A bill to create a legal cause of action for licensees against underaged persons who get access to our licensed premises through the use of fake identification.

The NJLBA threat matrix continues to include many bills seeking to benefit various NJ producers of craft alcoholic beverages. From the craft brewers seeking selling outlets all over the State of NJ to the possibility of craft producers being able to cross-carry all of the other NJ craft alcoholic beverages, thus creating homegrown bars and liquor stores, the NJLBA has its defensive hands full. But, we also have our focused eyes clearly on seeking positive change for our continually challenged on-premises sector. Stay tuned and... please continue to answer the NJLBA calls for action. Please come to Trenton to testify. Please stay in close contact with your Mayors, Senators and Assembly members. And, as always, please contribute to the NJLBA PAC – the mother's milk of politics.
